20 new HRS installed in fiscal 2020

The joint applications of JHyM (Japan H2 Mobility, LLC) and its members for the government subsidy program promoting the installation of hydrogen refueling stations (HRS) for commercial use have been adopted. Herewith, 20 new HRS are to be installed and 1 new company, Toagosei, has joined in JHyM; the number of JHyM's HRS becomes 55 units and the one of JHyM's participating companies has become 25. The HRS adopted in the past being added, there will be 143 units/157 locations nationwide.

JHyM installs HRS newly in Nagano, Fukui, Nara and Kumamoto prefectures, while more HRS are installed in Aichi prefecture which is one of the biggest FCV demand areas; nationwide HRS network will be further expanded. JHyM will continue to facilitate HRS development this year in order to follow the government's "The Strategic Road Map for Hydrogen and Fuel Cells."

Hideki Sugawara, Representative, Japan H2 Mobility, commented:

"Though JHyM has entered the third year since its establishment, the progress of HRS development has been steady. Their locations are well-balanced between urban and rural areas, and the entry of new companies is also steadily increasing.

JHyM tries to gain momentum for the hydrogen mobility society by achieving the Road Map's goal of "160 locations in 2020" in the government's Basic Hydrogen Strategy."



Hydrogen station installation plan in fiscal 2020 (ordered by grant number)


